

### Welcome to Mariemont Players

The Mariemont Players (MPI) was formed 87 years ago as a church group that performed plays in the village of Mariemont, Ohio. Founded in 1936, the group began a regular season of performances in the 1950s and was incorporated as a not-for-profit organization on August 28, 1956 by its president, Woodrow (Woody) Jarrett. In honor of Woody & Lois Jarrett's longtime commitment to the theater, the auditorium is named for them.

In 1960, for slightly more than \$8000, the group bought the old Plainville four-room school building. Volunteer members have been converting the structure into the Walton Creek Theater ever since. The original cornerstone was laid in 1869, but the present solid brick building at the intersection of Walton Creek and Muchmore Roads dates from 1910. We're fortunate to be one of the few local community theaters with a permanent home. Our continuing improvements to the building include a remodeled auditorium with new seating, aisle lights and an electromagnetic hearing loop for the hearing-impaired. Our elevator to the auditorium accommodates those with physical handicaps, including wheelchairs. A handicap accessible restroom is on the first floor.

The Players have had 1000s of members during the past 85 years. Some have even become film actors, Broadway musical directors and played roles in professional theater, TV commercials, corporate videos and voice-overs plus dozens of support roles in media and the creative arts.

**The Book of Will** is a fictionalized history, a dramatic comedy, and several love stories, among other thinga. The sudden death of one of their friends propels John Heminges and Henry Condell into a quest to collect, and later publish, Shakespeare's works. Along the way, supported by their families and friends, they encounter, and often overcome, obstacles to their mission.

Lauren Gunderson, one of the (for several years THE) country's most-produced living playwrights, has provided us with a rich, heartwarming, often funny story that we hope you will enjoy.

The last production I directed here was the canceled-by-Covid *Earth and Sky*. As we continue our retreat from the shadow of the pandemic, I'd like to thank the MPI Board and Artistic Committee for allowing me to direct this story of collaboration among friends and family. I'd also like to thank the cast and crew of *The Book of Will* for lending their considerable talents to this production.

On a personal note: It's possible I would not have become involved in theatre if it had not been for my father. He was regularly involved with theatrical productions with a few groups around town for a couple of decades. Hearing Loops allow people who wear hearing aids to directly receive the sound from the stage microphones in their own hearing aids. If your hearing aids have a wireless receiver called a T-coil or telecoil, just switch it on. Talk to your audiologist to see if your instruments are so equipped and how to activate it. Many hearing devices can have either a T (no background noise pickup) or MT program (blended microphone and T-coil program).

If your hearing aid doesn't have a telecoil, you may borrow a separate loop receiver with a headset, available in the first floor lobby. Ask an usher if you would like to use one.



**jef brown** (Director/Set Design) - Although he has done his fair share of acting and designing over the years, jef prefers to direct whenever he can. Jef has also directed productions for many other local theatres, including *Arcadia, The Turn of the Screw, The Girls of Miller's Court, Born Yesterday, The Magic Fire, Blood Relations, November, An Inspector Calls, Speaking in Tongues, That Darn Plot!, Communicating Doors, The Woman in Black, The Voice of the Prairie, The Lion in Winter, Waiting for the Parade, Cotton Patch Gospel, The House of Blue Leaves and Jeffrey. In addition, he has acted, designed lights, sets and sound and served as a consultant to many of Cincinnati's theatre groups. ### For Your Comfort and Safety

- **Restrooms:** An handicap-accessible restroom on the first floor lobby level, and two additional restrooms in the basement.
- Refreshments: Available prior to show and during intermission in the first floor Hurst lobby.
- Elevator: Accessible from parking lot, lobby and auditorium. Ask an usher for assistance.
- Emergency Exits: Located at the left and right of the front aisle and at the left and right sides of the stage.
- AED (Automated External Defibrillator): Located on the top landing just outside the auditorium, designed to be used by anyone in a case of sudden cardiac arrest.
- **Hearing Loop:** For the hearing-impaired patron with a T-coil equipped hearing aid. If your hearing aid is equipped with a wireless receiver called a T-coil or telecoil, just switch it on. If your hearing aid doesn't have a telecoil, you may borrow a separate loop receiver with a headset, available in the first floor lobby will call area.

- PLEASE be sure all cell phones, pagers and personal alarms are <u>TURNED OFF</u>, not just placed on silent or vibrate.


